

DPD CHAPLAINS

The Dalton Police Department's Police Chaplains Program was established to better care for the emotional and spiritual well-being not just of the department's officers and non-sworn employees, but also of the people the department serves in our community. The department's chaplains are all volunteers and many serve as pastors at area churches. They all receive special training to serve as chaplains with the department.

The chaplains serve a variety of roles in the agency. They visit our officers and their families when they are injured, sick, or if they are killed. Chaplains are always available to speak to officers about problems they may be having whether personal or professional – the job of a police officer can be taxing emotionally and the chaplains are trained in how to counsel police officers. Chaplains can also be called upon to teach training classes on such topics as stress management or ethics to serve our officers. Chaplains can also counsel the family members of our employees. Chaplains often assist our officers with one of their most difficult duties: informing a member of our community that a loved one has died.
